EndNote X2 – EndNote is a software tool for publishing and managing bibliographies

For Windows (available through Help Desk for UTSA-owned and ASAP for personal use)

For Mac (available through Help Desk for UTSA-owned; soon-to-be-available through ASAP for personal use)

JMP 8 – JMP 8 is statistical discovery software.

For Windows only (available through Help Desk for UTSA-owned; soon-to-be-available through ASAP for personal use)

McAfee 8.6 for Windows – Available through Help Desk for UTSA-owned and ASAP for personal use

McAfee 8.6 for Mac – Available through Help Desk for UTSA-owned; negotiating with vendor for personal use
